Parking at Westshore School

Late Attendance / Absence from School

Students arriving late to school or those students having time away from school for reasons that are not justified is getting out of hand and if it continues those families will be receiving a letter. School starts at 8.55am each day and it is a legal requirement that students attend at the correct time. The Ministry of Education has requested my attendance records so they too might be making contact with those families concerned. If your child is late to school they must report to the office straight away on arrival. If students are not at school the school needs to be contacted and given an explanation about the absence.
